Multiple national level programmes owned and managed by different ministries / components of the NRP owned and implemented by different public institutions.



Development and timing of DNSH (and CP) guidance at the national level



Inconsistencies in the experience and knowledge base on the DNSH-related topics across entities managing public investments



Main challenges



Decentralisation & incoherent approach

- Identification and communication of the DNSH requirements to applicants
 - Lack of alignment in how requirements are communicated, and responsibility shifted
 - Inconsistencies in the level of detail and documentation provided
- Uncertain sufficiency of the current approach across owners

Communication

Fragmentation and lack of communication and alignment across entities

Complexity

- Inconsistencies in the detail of instructions provided to applicants
- Additional administrative burden for applicants and involved stakeholders

Data & information

 Limited solutions to collection, sharing and leveraging existing/generated data (e.g. data repositories, platforms, resources).

FRAMEWORK DNSH AND CLIMATE PROOFING GUIDELINES

- Synthesis of the RRF DNSH guidance and climate proofing guidelines
- Building on RRF experience and EC's recommendations on best practices
- Context of the EU Taxonomy and climate / environmental tagging of the EU budget
- Recipient all managing authorities of EU funds, where DNSH based on Art. 17 of the Taxonomy regulation is mandatory; addition of guidance on climate proofing for EU funds under Common Provisions Regulation
- Focus on environmental materiality translated into common-level recommendations for EU funds' implementation



FRAMEWORK GUIDELINES - DNSH AND CLIMATE PROOFING ASSESSMENT PHASE

- Managing authorities should conduct both DNSH and where possible climate proofing assessment on the level of the calls or higher strategic level
- The applicants should be informed with concrete technical requirements to be implemented in the projects
- Proposing flexibility and proportionality complience with DNSH also through support intensity and / or bonification of environmentally ambitious projects
- Specification of the infrastructure definition for climate proofing



FRAMEWORK GUIDELINES - DNSH AND CLIMATE PROOFING IMPLEMENTATION PHASE

- DNSH defining for each envi. objectives common-ground recommentations when the managing authorities should implement higher environmental ambition above the current legislative framework
- Climate proofing building on the EC's guidance, but filling certain gaps, esp. simplified climate risks overview in the context of the Czech Republic
- Investment specific annexes
 - Construction of new buildings
 - Renovation of existing buildings
 - Construction waste reuse and recycling
 - Transport vehicles purchases



GOVERNANCE OF DNSH IN NATIONAL RECOVERY PLAN - MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND TRADE

MIT's procedural DNSH methodological guidance:

- assessment phase DNSH self-asseement on the level of the component and negotiation with EC
- identintification phase CID, operational agreement, national documentation
- implementation phase administration of grants and public procurement
- ex-post monitoring before payment request at EC

Ministry of Industry and Trade coordinates the process, steps of DNSH cycle are formalized.

Ad hoc consultations with the Ministry of the Environment.



GOVERNANCE OF DNSH AND CLIMATE PROOFING IN CPR FUNDS - MINISTRY OF REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- DNSH self-asseement on the level of specific objective of each programme
- Climate proofing usually on the level of projects, but in cases where possible on the level of the call
- EC validates the approach in each programme through monitoring committee
- implementation phase administration of grants

Framework DNSH and climate proofing guidance (and ad hoc high-level consultations) by the Ministry of the Environment provides non-biding recommendations for managing authorities. Formalization of the process is foreseen after methodological consolidation, taking into account outputs of the TSI project.





Recovery Plan in Spain: PRTR Governance

- Governance: Royal Decree-Law 36/2020 (measures for the modernisation of the Public Administration and for the implementation of the Recovery, Transformation and Resilience Plan)
 - MRR Responsible and Coordinating Authority: Ministry of Finance, General Directorate for the Recovery and Resilience Plan
 - MRR Control Authority: National Audit Office
- Management rules: Ministerial Orders HFP/1030/2021 (Management system of the RRF Plan) and HFP/1031/2021 (Information system) addressed to the public sector at national, regional and local level.
 - Decision-making Entities: responsible for measures and components and for supervising and monitoring the implementing bodies' achievement
 - Implementing bodies: execution of milestones and targets



Each Ministry is ultimately responsible of establishing management and control procedures for their assigned measures and components (antifraud, green and digital tagging, DNSH, state aid, double funding, communication, etc)











Division for Monitoring the Application of Environmental Legislation (DNSH Division)

National Plan's negotiation: Coordination and assistance functions for all Departments of the Administration.

Creation of **DNSH Division** on December 9, 2021, through <u>Order TED/1374/2021</u>, as an expert administrative entity which reports directly to the Undersecretary for Ecological Transition and the Demographic Challenge. Functions and responsibilities:

- Assistance to Ministries on compliance with the do no significant harm principle and green tagging
- Information, coordination and **supervision of public policies** to ensure they are in accordance with Spanish environmental policy and European regulations of recovery plan.
- Training sessions for public administration on DNSH and green tagging
- Creation of **application**, **execution** and **monitoring guides** for policy implementation in accordance with DNSH and environmental regulations.











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

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



Training on DNSH and climate tagging

At the National Institute for Public Administration, for all Ministries:

- Staff from all Departments, attendance 250 people online
- Newly enrolled civil servants (4 training courses on 2022)

- staff dealing with the national recovery and resilience plan

Challenges identified

- Public administration's lack of DNSH/Taxonomy/Green expertise.
- Diversity of criteria on models and templates for each legal instrument implementing investments.
- Lack of a consolidated framework and resources in order to establish a common methodology and procedures for DNSH principle implementation.
- Integration of taxonomy into budgetary policy-making: Lack of expertise, resources, data and methodologies to assess environmental and climate effects











Additional tasks: Green Budget

- ✓ Law 7/2021 on Climate Change and Energy Transition: GB Mandate Article 30.1
- ✓ **Recovery, Transformation and Resilience Plan:** Component 29 "Improving the efficiency of public spending" includes reform C29.R3 "Alignment of the General State Budget with the ecological transition (green budgeting)".



Helpdesk: centralized point of contact for DNSH related enquiries.

Collaborative approach: assist federal project leaders during the entire life cycle of their projects (preparation, implementation and reporting).

Expertise: provide an evaluation of the self-assessments made by line ministries and companies.

Capacity-building: development of methodological tools (e.g. guidance, check-lists, templates, etc.) and training of line ministries in the use of such tools; training of public service companies (e.g. railroad) on DNSH principle and requirements.

Representation: participate in the national DNSH network

Lessons learnt



- Reach out fast and often to line ministries: communication is key
- Integrate the DNSH principle early and in every relevant documents
- **Trainings** (200+ public servants)
- Consolidate information and share them widely
- Extending the DNSH principle beyond the RRP
- Strong support from federal governement (+6 public servants)
- Useful to develop practical tools to assist enterprises in their ex-ante analyses
