- Plant containing multiple substances
- "Entourage" effect (cannabinoids, flavonoids, trephines)
- Recreational use
- Smoking (decarboxylation)

- Political pressure
- Prejudice
- Media
- Abusers

Future methods of administration

- Inhalers
- Suppository
- Cutaneous administration (ointments)
- Patches
- Food supplements
- Cosmetics
- Veterinary

Administration 2

- Smoking
- Vapor/inhalers
- Oil extractions
- Oral route cookies and tea
- Ointments
- Average dosage ~33 gram per month



Forms of Medicinal Cannabis

Research for future indications

- Narcotic detoxification
- Head trauma
- Psychiatric disorders
- Psoriasis and Atopic dermatitis
- Tinnitus
- Autoimmune diseases
- Graft VS. Host disease

Process of approval (previous)

- 1. Request submitted by specialist
- 2. Data, including diagnosis and medication report, produced by family physician
- 3. Psychological\psychiatric opinion (if needed)
- Approved licenses\prescrioptions transferred to licensed distributers
- 5. Pre-usage instructors guidance

Current process

- 1. Computerized system
- 2. All data sent to an e-mail address
- Licenses and prescriptions sent back via email
- 4. Physicians requested to specify THC and CBD percentages and genetic lines

Renewal process

- Every 6-12 months, physician's follow up
- Dosage addition 10 Gr (max.)
- Demands for increasing dosages carefully examined
- Follow-up by specialists
- Transfer of authority to primary care physicians if possible

Indications



Approved indications

- Preconditions for treatment for approval: failure of other conventional treatments
- Recognized indications published by the Ministry Of Health (circular 106)
- Appeals committee reviews special cases
- Experts committee evaluates new and old indications

Oncology

- 40% of the patients
- Symptoms such as vomiting, chemoassociated pain, weight loss and nausea during and after treatment
- Primary and metastatic pain, after failure of conventional treatment
- End of life palliation
- Discontinuation of treatment ??
- Case report: Parliament member wife

Palliative treatment

- Intractable pain after failure of treatment at least one year
- Neuropathic pain (recognized as of organic source), and not relieved after a year's treatment in pain clinic
- Oncology patients exempted from waiting

Neurology

- Patients diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis suffering from spasticity
- Parkinson's patients suffering from chronic pain caused by rigidity
- **ADULT** Patients with **Tourrete** syndrome suffering from severe functional impairments
- Treatment is contraindicated in cases of active psychosis
- Epilepsy

Neurology⁽²⁾

- Uncontrolled epilepsy in children (> 1,000 patients) - case study: From 200 convulsions/day to < 20/day
- Autistic spectrum (> 1,000 patients) ofiicially not yet a recognized indication
- Case study: 8-years old



Neurology(3)

- ALS
- Fibromyalgia approved only in severe cases with recommendation from a psychiatrist+ rheumatologist/neurologist/pain specialist (> 900 patients) - case study: Pregnant woman with fibromyalgia



Gastroenterology

- Crohn's disease severe cases that did not respond to all other treatments (>1,000 patients)
- Ulcerative colitis (150 patients)
- IBD severe cases
- Appeal committee for special cases review

Psychiatry

- Unsolved dilemma PTSD
- Following unsuccessful psychological and medical treatments
- Over 2,000 patients treated
- Late onset of PTSD
- C/I: psychiatric comorbidities and history of addiction

Opthalmology

 Previously approved but lately revoked by the specialists in glaucoma cases



Pain clinics

- Over- flooded
- A fertile ground for manipulative and violent patients/imposters



Controversial issues

- Driving under influence
- Recreational vs. medical usage 1,000,000 vs. 38,000

Pregnancy and Lactation

- No research for obvious reasons
- Cognitive impairment children
- The Woodstock experience (1969)





Treatment during hospitalization



From ILLEGAL substance to MEDICATION

- Research to establish recognized indications
- Evaluation of efficacy and adverse events
- Start up projects metered dose vaporizers
- Production of GMP approved medications
- Distribution via pharmacies
- Structured patient education process (e.g. efficient material consumption)
